Definitions

Advocacy - Safety planning, risk assessment, crisis intervention, exploring options, outreach, education, intervention with systems

Counseling - Individual short or long term counseling

Medical Advocacy - Assistance navigating health care system, connecting client with medical provider, education about health effects of domestic violence

Referrals - Referrals to shelter, legal services, housing programs, mental health providers, food and clothing resources, education, job training and other community services

Accompaniment - To court, medical appointments, community meetings, etc.

Support Groups - Support groups, psycho-educational groups forums, educational workshops for clients

Consultation to Providers - Case review, domestic violence information, community resource information, and debriefing for health care providers

Training/Education - Educational/Training sessions provided to hospital employees, awareness activities throughout the hospital, trainings for community agencies

Emergency Fund - Financial or in-kind assistance for clients to meet urgent needs such as food, clothing, transportation, and other forms of assistance.

Safe Bed Program - Short-term accommodations for client (or client with children) in hospital bed or ability to admit client to hospital based on social/safety concerns.

Children's Services - Direct services for children of survivors including assessment, referrals, play therapy

Community Partnerships - Creation and maintenance of partnerships between health care-based DV programs and community-based programs with goals of addressing gaps in service, cross-training, and cross-referrals
